Starting With a Thorough Risk Assessment

Every warehouse relocation begins with a risk assessment on arrival, including a formal pre-start assessment appropriate to the job type. Floors, walls, doors, and loading areas are inspected for pre-existing conditions and photographed before work begins, giving both your business and our crew a clear, documented starting point.

Inventory Control at Scale

Warehouses hold volume, and volume means the risk of items being lost, mislabelled, or misplaced grows without a disciplined process. Every item moved receives a detailed condition report and label, checked off as it's loaded — the same rigour applied to a small office move, scaled to handle a much larger inventory. This tracking is what makes it possible to confirm, with confidence, that everything that left your old warehouse has arrived at the new one.

Safe Handling of Heavy and Bulk Items

Warehouse equipment — racking, pallets, machinery, bulk stock — is rarely light. Heavy or awkward items are always handled by a team, never a single person, and lifting equipment such as trollies and dollies is prioritised ahead of manual lifting. This isn't just about protecting the goods; it's about protecting the crew from injury on jobs that involve genuinely heavy loads.

Protecting the Site

Moving large volumes of equipment through a warehouse space puts real pressure on flooring and structural elements if it's rushed or handled carelessly. Our teams never drag, push, or pull items across floors, even with protective padding in place, and floor protection is installed in all traffic and working areas before reinstatement begins at the new site.

Load Security in Transit

With warehouse volumes, load integrity in the truck matters just as much as careful loading and unloading. Items are securely strapped to prevent shifting during transit, with padding used to separate goods and prevent them colliding with each other or the truck walls — critical for preventing damage across a large, densely packed load.

Documentation From Start to Finish

Before-and-after photography is standard on every commercial job, and warehouse relocations are no exception. Photos are taken of every affected area both before the uplift and after reinstatement, creating a complete record that protects your business and gives you confidence the job was done properly.
