What Cost of Living Actually Covers

Cost of living guides typically break down housing (rent or mortgage), utilities, groceries, transport, and general lifestyle expenses for a destination city or suburb. Housing Costs Vary Significantly

Capital cities like Sydney and Melbourne generally carry higher rental and purchase prices than regional centres or outer suburbs. Before locking in a moving date, research median rental and property prices for your specific destination suburb — city-wide averages can be misleading.

Don't Forget the Moving Costs Themselves

Your relocation budget should include the removalist quote (transport, packing materials, insurance), any storage fees if there's a gap between move-out and move-in dates, and incidental costs like connecting utilities at your new address.
